Manager's Report

Shared an updated document with all vacancies on our boards and commissions. There is going to be an update on the website regarding an opening on the Zoning Board in light of the resignation of Bob Galbraith, Chairman of Zoning Hearing Board. Will be posting information to our website.

Spoke on the current equipment purchases for the traffic preemption devices for the Swarthmore Ave. They are still 10-16 weeks from installation?

Council Business

Councilor Guerra provided updates on the ARPA projects which were discussed at the most recent Council Meeting:

Portable Radios for Emergency Services:

1) Kenwood \$4,622.00 for portable radios. These units would go into all emergency vehicles. Will be working with Fire and Police Chief and public safety committee to budget for these numbers. This project is still thirty-six months outstanding.

Lost Revenue for Ridley Park Borough:

1) This would be around \$100,000. This is figure is based on losses resulting from lack of meter parking, parking tickets, room rentals and other incidentals due to the pandemic.

Catania Park Sports Alliance Project:

1) On Hold at this time

Firehouse Repairs and Drainage:

1) This would be a reimbursement to a capital project. This project is completed at a cost of approximately\$30,000- to help drainage and mold remediation at the fire house meeting rooms

Tree Planting and Maintenance:

- 1) This project would be \$8-10 for trees and other supplies—8-10 k?
- 2) \$6,000 for labor and maintenance

Library Drainage and Roof Gutters

1) \$32,000 would be the total of the projects for repairs to the roof- cost is due to unique historical structure?

Other projects will be addressed in upcoming meetings.

Council President Collins mentioned the Junior Council positions is still open and if anyone is interested, please reach out to the Borough.

Public Comment

Mike Gale 51 Collier Circle: Asked if the backboards at Hetzel park can be replaced and one installed as it is missing? Brought to the attention to Council that the sign at Hetzel and Collier was struck and now installed on a telephone pole. Asked if this is temporary or permanent. Is the Borough going to Greenways grants? Shared information that RCN Channel 52 is currently only

showing color bars. Asked if the businesses are being charged by the County Health Department for their inspections. Concerned about double charging of the business. Lastly, shared that the County's household hazards waste event will be in Chichester in the coming weeks. Will need to register for the event.

Mike Dougherty 315 Burke Ave: Was there an issue at the middle school with a weapon? Councilor Dalessio shared that the issue was at the Community Center and not in Ridley Park. This was during dismissal time. Councilor Dalessio noted the response time from police was immediate and the "firearm" was not a real firearm. Mr. Dougherty also reiterated from last workshop meeting about sharing the crime status on the police website. Burke and Johnson Ave, have they been sighted for the current situation regarding overgrowth and piles on property which attract mosquitoes

Sandy Hess 317 Burke: Grass is not cut on the side of the Jonshon/Burke Ave. property Mr. Dougherty commented on. Grass is still hanging over the curb. Had concerns about the budgeting for larger projects and suggested we budget for these projects sooner.

Andy Furman 419 Pomeroy: Asked about the TV equipment—will the next Regular Meeting be broadcast? Mr. Furman asked if there were still talks on using the ARPA money for renovations to the Pumphouse and what those options may cost. Asked if the Zoning Hearing Board vacancy that was created needs to be filled within 30 days. How long does the resolution needs to be considered before funds can be spent? Asked when Yard Waste will go back to once a month for the year as it is nearing the fall season.
