L. Pinto noted that this time next year we should do another civil service test for the retirees that are in the pike. We should also look at a new solicitor.

Public Comment

Mike Gale- 51 Collier Circle

Regarding the reimbursement to the Borough, that was originally 80k, can you explain why this went up? Tutak noted that this is based on the tax rate and other streams of revenue that were lost (parking tickets, permits, room rentals etc.).

There are 4 ARPA motions for tonight, D. Collins mentioned the four projects. There is a motion to change the tax rate for property located at 10-16 Hinkley Avenue (FOLIO 37-00-00959-00) at an assessment of \$693,000 for Tax Years 2021 and 2022 and \$580,180 for Tax Year 2023 as recommended by the solicitor and the Ridley Township School District. That is owed by the School Board President, is it normal for this change between 2022-2023. Tutak noted that this came directly over from the school district from our solicitor. We aren't involved with the appeal.

The new trash extension, is there going to be an increase for trash and recycling next year? D. Collins mentioned that we don't have the numbers yet but there is most likely an increase.

The Delco Greenways grant for 111. E. Rodgers street, what is it for? Secretary Staccone explained the grant.
