The mayor spoke on the Sellers Ave Bridge meeting that was held last week. Several residents spoke to Amtrak and PennDot about their concerns for the bridge. A slide show was presented with drawings and a timeline for the project. This is available online. Amtrak stated there is only a short period of time during the night when the power can be shut off and new lines run.

The chief and the Mayor took all the crossing guards for their annual luncheon. 18 of them attended. Mayor Hank thanked them all for caring for our children.

- The dining ordinance has been sent to Delaware County Planning for review and comment. Once comments are received an ad will be placed in the paper for adoption at the July Regular Meeting.
- Working with Councilor Michael McGinley, Vice President Richard Guerra and Borough Engineer on Trash Specification for the upcoming trash and recycling bids as our contract with JP Mascaro ends at the end of 2023.

Public Comment

Edna Hall Cook- Member of the Ridley Park Pool

Her family were original members of the pool, she was a member of the swim team. The pool was a wonderful place to spend the summer. It was also known as the most picturesque pool in Delaware County. The pool has come on hard times and membership is down. The Borough needs to help this for the residents. Unfortunately, the pool has come on hard times in the past. They are working hard to make it a great place again. The pools have been refurbished but the tables and umbrellas are in horrible condition. It takes money to replace these items but unfortunately the pool doesn't have the funds. Many volunteer hours have been spent cleaning the outside of the building. Ms. Cook is a member, not on the board, but she has been there since the beginning. She realizes that the pool is private and she's not asking for money but maybe a donation of tables and umbrellas, or manpower to help remove the brush. Is there extra blacktop that can be used to surface the holes. She is hoping that the Borough manger and president of the pool can sit down and talk about what we all can do to help the pool. Membership is dwindling.

The AED's that are being purchased; do you know what they actual cost is after the donations? The resolution is for \$10,000.

Mike's wife texted stating the TV has no sound. In the meantime, can a video be placed on the website. Can the past videos be placed online? The meetings are not being recorded. Dalessio stated that there is no one working the camera to record it. Tutak stated that he is not sure why the volume isn't working once it leaves our network. The problem is we need support from volunteers in the community to help with this. There used to be a committee of volunteers that ran the camera and record the video. There is no reason to purchase new equipment if what we have it working correctly. Mattus stated that we have no leverage to fix this with the cable companies because they give this as part of the franchise fees. Mike stated that he thought these meetings were being recorded, they have not been since no one can run the equipment. Dalessio stated we've reached out to the schools for help but are unable to find help with these devices.
