#### **Public Comment**

Andy Furman 419 Pomeroy Street

There is talk about the new parking system, comparing the two systems. The one system is CODY that is 50k plus 18k for a yearly fee. There was mention about printers but it was not mentioned how much they are and how many we are purchasing. M. Dalessio stated that he must be confused, Park Mobile is different than the new system.

Andy stated that there is still no cost for the printers for the police vehicles. L. Pinto stated he believes that it was included in the cost, the \$53K.

New fire protection system for the Borough Hall, Fire House and AC Club. The Library and Police station, are the additional buildings? Are we planning on using ARPA funds? D. Collins stated this is correct. Andy asked L. Pinto if the yearly cost is included. L. Pinto stated that he will have it for the next meeting. Manager stated this is the build out price, labor, equipment and supplies. Andy asked what the cost of central monitoring is, L. Pinto stated it is low, maybe \$350/year.

Mattus, stated there are benefits to the system, such as insurance discount.

Karen Donkin 322 W. Ridley Ave- one of the houses hit by the burglary.

Wanted to thank the police department for their amazing work during the burglary. She was home when this happened, the dogs were barking and scared him off.
